Face-to-Face with Death

FARM WORKER SURVIVES BLACK MAMBA BITE

Platinum Bushvelder newspaper | Thabazimbi – What began as an ordinary workday quickly turned into a fight for survival when farm worker Isaiah Tembe was bitten by one of Africa's most feared snakes, a black mamba.

The frightening incident occurred on Friday, 15 May 2026, while Tembe was repacking round poles on a farm near a marula tree. "I did not see the snake before it bit me," he recalled. "Only afterwards, when I looked down, I immediately recognised it as a black mamba."

The bite happened at approximately 11:40. Realising the seriousness of the situation, Tembe acted quickly by tying a sock above his knee before running to a nearby lodge to seek assistance. A coordinated emergency response soon followed. Three members of Spitskop Rural Safety assisted with transporting him to hospital, while Thaba Fire and Rescue alerted medical staff in advance so that treatment could begin immediately upon his arrival. Thanks to the swift action of everyone involved, Tembe received medical treatment within 45 minutes of being bitten.

The symptoms appeared almost immediately. "There was bleeding and a dull pain where I was bitten," he said. "About 15 to 20 minutes later, the pain became severe. My body started feeling heavy, almost like the beginning of paralysis. I also developed a terrible headache and pain in my eyes." Fortunately, Tembe never experienced breathing difficulties, one of the most dangerous effects associated with black mamba venom. Hospital staff administered emergency treatment, including what he believes was antivenom, and monitored his condition closely.

Despite the medical intervention, the emotional impact of the ordeal remains vivid. "I have always been told that a black mamba bite is extremely dangerous and often deadly," he said. "I honestly thought I was going to die." After several days of recovery, Tembe returned to work on 25 May. However, he admits the experience has left him far more cautious.

"Now even small noises, rustling in the grass, or birds moving nearby make me nervous," he said. "I'm also very wary of long grass." Tembe expressed heartfelt gratitude to his wife, employer, emergency responders and hospital staff whose quick actions helped save his life.

Black mambas are among the most dangerous snakes found in the Thabazimbi area, alongside cobras, puff adders and stiletto snakes. Their venom attacks the nervous system and can cause paralysis, breathing difficulties and death if treatment is delayed.

Residents are urged to remain alert in areas with long grass, rocky outcrops and wood piles where snakes may hide. If a snakebite occurs, experts advise remaining as calm as possible, limiting movement and seeking immediate medical assistance.

Platinum Bushvelder koerant | Thabazimbi – Wat op Saterdag 16 Mei 2026 as 'n gewone aand begin het, het binne oomblikke in 'n ondenkbare tragedie verander vir die Van Niekerk-gesin. 'n Motorongeluk het die lewens van Brendon van Niekerk en sy baba seun, Duan, geëis en 'n gesin agtergelaat wat nou nie net met diepe verlies worstel nie, maar ook met ernstige beserings en groot finansiële uitdagings.

Nicky Black, wat saam met haar gesin in die voertuig was, het haar pelvis en enkel gebreek. Sy wag tans op 'n operasie in die staatstelsel, maar die wagtyd is lank. Ten spyte van haar eie pyn en beperkte beweeglikheid, moes sy die moeilike taak aanpak om afskeid te neem van haar man en baba seun.

Haar jongste dogter, Luané van Niekerk (5), is ook ernstig beseer. Sy het haar bo-been en kakebeen gebreek en is na 'n hospitaal in Polkwane geneem waar sy operasies ondergaan het. Dokters is tevrede met haar herstel tot dusver, maar sy mag vir die volgende ses weke geen gewig op haar been plaas nie. Sy is op 3 Junie uit die hospitaal ontslaan en is nou tuis by haar ma en suster.

Die gesin staan egter voor verdere uitdagings. Omdat Nicky nie kan rondbeweeg nie en Luané gereelde

opvolgafsprake benodig, moet sy tans by haar oma in Randfontein bly. Die skeiding tussen ma en dogter is besonder moeilik. "Luané soek haar mamma; ons moet bymekaar wees. 'n Vyfjarige dogtertjie kan nie verstaan wat aangaan en hoekom sy nie by haar mamma kan wees nie," vertel Nicky hartseer.

Nog twee insittendes, Donovan en Megan Koen, wat saam met die Van Niekerks gereis het, het ook ernstige beserings opgedoen, hoofsaaklik inwendig. Megan is steeds in die hospitaal, terwyl Donovan tuis herstel.

Benewens die emosionele trauma, staar die gesin nou aansienlike begrafnis- en mediese uitgawes in die gesig. Angie Raath het 'n BackaBuddy-fondsinsamelingsveldtog namens die gesin begin en haar huis oopgestel om ondersteuning en versorging te bied gedurende hierdie moeilike tyd. Nicky ondersoek tans ook die moontlikheid van privaat mediese behandeling aangesien die wagtyd vir staatsbehandeling besonder lank is.

Lede van die gemeenskap wat die gesin wil ondersteun, kan die BackaBuddy-veldtog besoek. Enige bydrae, groot of klein, sal help om die finansiële druk op die gesin te verlig terwyl hulle die moeilike pad van rou, herstel en herbou stap.

Valterra Platinum empowers SMEs to diversify and build long-term resilience

On Tuesday, 26 May 2026, Valterra Platinum marked a significant milestone in its enterprise development efforts with the graduation of 63 small and medium enterprises (SMEs) from its Contractor Mentoring Support Programme, reinforcing its commitment to building a more resilient and diversified local supplier base.

The graduation ceremony, held in Mokopane, brought together SME owners, mentors and community stakeholders from Mogalakwena, Amandelbult, Rustenburg and Polokwane to recognise businesses that have strengthened their capabilities, expanded into new markets and reduced reliance on a single customer base.

Implemented under the company's Social Impact Mitigation Plan (SIMP), the Contractor Mentoring Support Programme is designed to enhance local supplier competitiveness, unlock sustainable economic participation and support SMEs in building more diversified, future-fit operations.

"This initiative is central to Valterra Platinum's sustainability strategy, which focuses on building resilient communities that can thrive

beyond mining," said Yvonne Mfolo, Executive Head of Corporate Affairs and Sustainability. "A strong, capable local supplier base is essential to shared prosperity, and when these businesses grow, communities grow with them."

Valterra Platinum invested over R14 million in the programme which delivered more than 3,800 hours of mentoring, combining structured training, specialist advisory and practical business support. High levels of engagement were recorded across cohorts, with some achieving bootcamp attendance rates exceeding 90%.

The impact is already measurable. Thirty-two percent of participating SMEs introduced new products or services during the programme, reducing dependence on a single client

and creating new revenue opportunities. Participating businesses collectively supported approximately 680 jobs, contributing to economic stability within host communities.

The programme also drove meaningful inclusion outcomes. Women-owned or women-led businesses accounted for 46.4% of participants, while 65.5% had significant black women ownership. Youth make up 46.5% of the workforce across participating SMEs, with women representing 25.5% of employees.

Beyond training, the emphasis on real-world application enabled SMEs to strengthen financial management, improve business planning and pursue opportunities outside traditional mining contracts. Many have already secured new customers beyond Valterra Platinum, marking tangible progress toward revenue diversification and long-term sustainability.

"A resilient supplier ecosystem is not built on procurement alone, but on capability, opportunity and reduced dependency on single contracts," Mfolo added. "This programme is helping to build a healthy host community supplier base, and create the conditions for SMEs to scale, compete and thrive independently."

Valterra Platinum will now undertake a final impact verification process to consolidate outcomes and inform future enterprise development initiatives.



Building safer communities through partnership, prevention and purpose

Valterra Platinum is strengthening its commitment to safer, stronger and more resilient communities through a combination of prevention-focused programmes, community partnerships and long-term social investment initiatives across Limpopo and the North West.

These engagements provide valuable insight into career opportunities in mining, engineering, environmental management, finance, safety, human resources, and technical trades. 4,500 learners inspired at Rustenburg Career Expo

More than 4,500 Grade 12 learners filled the Rustenburg Civic Centre on 24 February 2026 for the Rustenburg Career Expo – a large-scale initiative aimed at helping young people make informed decisions about their futures. Hosted by the Rustenburg Community Development Trust (RCDT) in partnership with Valterra Platinum and the Department of Education, the expo featured over 30 exhibitors from sectors including mining, aviation, healthcare, ICT, manufacturing and education.

Learners engaged directly with professionals, explored bursary and study opportunities, and gained insight into diverse career paths. The event highlighted the importance of collaboration between communities, industry and government in empowering the next generation with knowledge, confidence and hope.



Previous editions of the expo have positively impacted local communities through university application support, improved access to bursaries, educator development workshops, and initiatives supporting learners living with disabilities. In addition to career guidance, the expo also promoted safety awareness by encouraging young people to adopt safe and responsible practices within their communities and beyond. The Joint Career Expo reflected the mining sector's continued commitment to investing in education, youth development, and the long-term socio-economic sustainability of surrounding communities. For Valterra Platinum, investing in education means investing in the future leaders of the region. Commenting on the initiative, Loot Van Dyk, Manager External

Relations and Sustainability, Mototolo Mine at Valterra Platinum, said the programme aligns with the company's long-term sustainability strategy and belief in the transformative power of education.

Valterra Platinum invests in safer, smarter communities through major infrastructure projects

As part of its ongoing commitment to sustainable community development, Valterra Platinum is investing more than R129 million into critical infrastructure upgrades across Mokopane and surrounding communities in partnership with the Mogalakwena Local Municipality (MLM).

The projects, which focus on energy security, road infrastructure and municipal service delivery, form part of the company's broader socio-economic development commitments aimed at improving the daily lives of residents while supporting safer and more resilient communities.

Bringing light and safety to communities

One of the flagship projects currently underway is the installation of solar streetlights across seven villages and two local clinics within the Mapela and Mokopane areas. With a total investment of R86.5 million, the project will see approximately 2,500 solar-powered streetlights installed in Sekuruwe, Phafola Maloka, Phafola Molokomme, Sandsloot Mabuela, Sandsloot Masenya, Magope and Fothane, as well as at Mapela and Tshamahansi clinics.

The initiative was developed following requests from communities for improved lighting and safer public spaces. Poor lighting in many villages has contributed to increased vulnerability to crime and safety concerns for residents travelling through the area. Working closely with MLM, Valterra Platinum opted for a solar-powered solution which includes the design, supply, delivery, installation and commissioning of the solar streetlights, as well as maintenance during the warranty period.

Beyond improving visibility and security, the project is expected to create approximately 90 temporary employment opportunities for local residents, including women and young people, during the installation phase.

Revitalising key roads in Mokopane

In a further investment into public infrastructure and road safety, Valterra Platinum is allocating over R29 million towards the resealing of six major streets in Mokopane. The project includes upgrades to Dudu Madisha Street, Geyser Street, Bezuidenhout Street, Voor Street, Kruger Street and Piet Retief Street, covering a combined distance of more than 15 kilometres.

According to the municipality, deteriorating roads and delayed maintenance have negatively affected road safety, transport efficiency and local economic activity. Poor road conditions also increase vehicle maintenance costs for residents and businesses while limiting access to services and economic opportunities. The resealing project aims to extend the lifespan of the road network while improving driving conditions and public safety throughout Mokopane. Valterra Platinum will also conduct technical road assessments to support long-term infrastructure planning. Construction activities are expected to create at least 15 local employment and contracting opportunities.



Valterra Platinum celebrates completion of landmark Steel Bridge project in Sekhukhune

Valterra Platinum has joined government and industry partners in celebrating the successful completion and official opening of the landmark Steelpoort River Bridge project in Limpopo's Sekhukhune District; a transformative infrastructure development expected to improve mobility, safety and access for thousands of community members.

Officially known as CONTRACT NO: RAL/C989/2020: Upgrading and Maintenance of Bridge over Steelpoort River on Road D2219 in the Sekhukhune District of Limpopo Province, the project was implemented through Roads Agency Limpopo in partnership with eight mining companies operating in the region as part of their Social and Labour Plan (SLP) commitments and support for the Special Presidential Package programme.

The project included the construction of a new bridge over the Steelpoort River as well as extensive rehabilitation works to the existing steel bridge along Road D2219, a critical route connecting surrounding villages and communities to economic and social opportunities. Situated near the Ga Malekana and Kokwaneng villages within the Greater Tubatse Local Municipality, the bridge serves as an important transport link for local residents, commuters, businesses and mine employees travelling between communities and surrounding operations via the SANRAL-owned R555 route.

The newly completed 62-metre-long bridge was designed to accommodate growing traffic volumes and improve long-term road safety in the area. The structure comprises three spans measuring 18m, 26m and 18m respectively and caters for a dual carriageway with four 3.5m lanes and 600mm-wide shoulders, resulting in an overall bridge width of 15.540m between parapets.

In addition to the new bridge construction, remedial works undertaken on the existing steel bridge included the replacement of damaged members, lateral stiffening of the bridge structure, replacement of deck concrete

infill, corrosion protection of steel members, repairs to abutment concrete, replacement of steel railings and the installation of approach guardrails and end blocks.

The project was collectively funded by Roads Agency Limpopo, Rakhoma Mining Resources, Dwarsrivier Chrome Mine, Glencore Operations South Africa (Pty) Ltd, Rustenburg Platinum (Pty) Ltd, Samancor Chrome (Pty) Ltd, Booyendal Platinum (Pty) Ltd, Tjate Platinum Corporation and Two Rivers Platinum, with the total project investment amounting to R127.4 million including VAT.

The completion of the bridge marks a significant milestone in collaborative infrastructure development within the province and demonstrates the positive impact that can be achieved when government and the private sector work together to address community needs.

For Valterra Platinum, the project reflects the company's ongoing commitment to creating sustainable value beyond mining by investing in infrastructure that strengthens connectivity, enhances safety and contributes to improved quality of life for host communities.

The upgraded infrastructure is expected to reduce travelling times, improve access to schools, healthcare facilities and economic centres, while also supporting safer daily travel for employees and community members who rely on the route.

Valterra Platinum remains committed to partnering with stakeholders to drive inclusive development initiatives that leave a lasting and meaningful impact across the communities in which it operates.
